Facts about 4-H Council:

- Meetings last about an hour.
- ➢ All meetings begin at 7:00 p.m.
- > Meetings are held at Pottorf Hall, in the large meeting room.
- 4-H Council has a President, Vice President, Secretary, Financial Liaison, Reporter and Parliamentarian. Officers are elected at the November meeting.



- There are 6 meetings held in a year. Meetings are held on the first Monday of every other month, except September, due to holiday conflicts. <u>Meetings for the 2014-2015 year are</u>;
- November 3rd, January 5th, March 2nd, May 4th, July 6th, and August 24th.
 Council representatives can choose to be a part of one county-wide committee. The committees meet during each 4-H Council meeting, for about 15 minutes. The committees are: Achievement Celebration, Club Day, Fashion Revue, Fair Dance, Amazing Fair Race/Fair Activity, Gavel Games, and Pop Stand.

What to Expect:

- Council meetings are called to order by the President. A person is selected, by the Parliamentarian, to lead the group in the flag salute and 4-H pledge.
- > Officer reports are then given, followed by an agent report.
- Representatives are then invited to break up and meet with their respective countywide committee.
- > The President calls the group back together, and committee reports are given.
- New business is discussed and votes are taken by a show of each representative's voting card.
- > Announcements are offered, followed by adjournment.
- > Everyone assists with putting away tables and chairs.



4-H Council is an organization that represents the views of each club. As a representative, you represent your club's viewpoints during 4-H Council. The
representatives are responsible for taking information back to the 4-H Club. If a representative must be absent, it is recommended that a replacement be found for that meeting.
