WHEAT PLOT RESULTS

Most wheat yield reports I heard this year ranged from 50 to 80 bushels per acres in Riley

county. I think we'd have to say this was a good wheat year,...if you just consider yield. If you

consider price,...then ouch!

I don't think there are many who expected to go back to the LDP days. We didn't expect

prices to get this low, but here we are. So, let's quickly review how this works. LDP stands for

Loan Deficiency Payment. The LDP kicks in when the PCP (Posted County Price) drops below

the loan rate. The PCP last week was \$3.09 and the loan rate was \$3.15, yielding a \$.06 per

bushel LDP.

LDP payments are handled through the FSA Office – that's Farm Service Agency, if

you're trying to keep up with the acronyms – and must be requested before you sell the grain.

So, the game we play now is to try to pick the day wheat is at its' lowest, request the LDP, then

hold the crop and wait for a higher price. Basically, it's just another way to gamble.

This year's wheat plot was kind of a community effort, with Ronnie and Roger Nelson

planting and Nathan Klocke harvesting the plot, located about 5 miles north of Randolph. The

plot was planted no-till behind soybeans on October 12, 2015, and harvested June 30, 2016.

The ground was dry at planting time and stayed dry until December, resulting in a less-

than-perfect stand. In March the plot still looked tough, then rains in late April and all of May

made a good crop.

Yield results are shown in the following table. The initial moisture was 15% when we tried to cut at 11:00 a.m. We waited 30 minutes, and it was dry, so you can ignore the moisture column. The unidentified varieties are from a company that requested not to have results published unless plots were replicated.
