- New Master Gardeners took basic training in the fall of 2017. (Consist of 48 hours of horticulture study) 308 total trained over the past 28 years.
- 41 Previously trained Master Gardeners participated in the program for 2017. (They are required to complete a minimum of 10 hours of continuing education and perform 10 hours of community education)
- 336 Advanced Training Hours
- Previously trained Master Gardeners participated in the State wide Advance Training held on K-State campus Oct. 7.
- 1,174 Hours of community horticulture education reported by Riley County Master Gardeners.
- 11,540 Contacts in Riley County
- \$28,340.36 Value given to Riley County
