Riley County 4-H Ambassadors promote 4-H and Extension youth programs and participation in Riley County, through the use of activities, presentations, personal connections, and media.

Responsibilities:

- Promote 4-H programs and opportunities by:
- Work as a team with Ambassadors, Advisors, and 4-H staff
- Attend scheduled meetings and activities
- Connect with younger 4-H members to inspire them to greater involvement
- Deliver presentations and programs promoting 4-H to community groups
- Create content for radio, print, and social media regarding 4-H promotion
- Recruit other teens to serve in the 4-H Ambassador role
- Serve as an Ambassador for two-year term

Skills Needed:

- Positive attitude
- Willingness to engage with youth and adults in individual conversation and public speaking venues
- Enthusiasm for the 4-H program
- Experience/knowledge of 4-H programs in Riley County and beyond
- Growing communication skills and ability to work well with diverse groups of people
- Ability to manage personal schedules, responsibilities, and commitments

Time Required:

A Riley County 4-H Ambassador position is a two-year term commitment to help maintain and pass along knowledge and experience in the program. This position, on average, requires 1-2 hours per month with additional time needed for specific activities and events.

Congrats to the Riley County Livestock Sweepstakes Team

The Riley County 4-H Livestock Sweepstakes Team competed in the 2026 Kansas State 4-H Livestock Sweepstakes Contests on August 22-23, on K-State Campus.

The event was the first State 4-H Event to be held in the new Bilbrey Family Event Center. The team had a great weekend of competition, along with over 300 competitors from across the state of Kansas. The weekend includes 4 separate contests; Livestock Judging, Livestock Skillathon, Meat Judging, and Livestock Quiz Bowl. The team scores from all four contests are then averaged for total points for the weekend and overall teams and individuals are named Sweepstakes Contest winners.

Team members included: Alena W, Kate B, Luke B, Dalyn E, Mason M, Cannon H, Lakyn H, Abigail H, and Loreli M.

The Riley County Team was named the Champion Livestock Judging Team, Champion Quiz Bowl Team, and the Reserve Champion Skillathon team. Punching their ticket to participate in national contests this fall in Quiz Bowl and Livestock judging. They were also named fourth overall "Sweepstakes" Team, which is the team score from all four contests. The group had many individual successes along with all their team accomplishments as well.

We encourage youth ages 14-18 (before January 1, 2027) to attend the Kansas Youth Leadership Weekend. It will be held **November 21-22** at Rock Spring 4-H Center.

Build your leadership skills and potential through workshops, consulting groups, inspirational speakers and more. More details will be shared soon.

There will also be an opportunity for adults to attend the Kansas 4-H Volunteer Lead Forum that will be held the same weekend.

Registration deadline is October 15.

The **Youth Council and National 4-H Conference application** will be combined, with applicants indicating if they are applying for one or both opportunities. Any Kansas 4-H member between the ages of 14 and 18 before January 1, 2027 may apply as a Council Rep and those 15-18 before January 1, 2027 may apply for National Conference.

This year's KYLF delegation will elect representatives from the four extension program regions (NE, NW, SE, SW) for one year terms on council. Up to six National Conference delegates will be selected through an interview process at KYLF and they serve a two year term on council.

Checklist for
4-H Leaders**

- Check club mailbox at the Extension Office
- Highlight key points/deadlines from the 4-H newsletter & calendar at club meeting
- Elect Club Officers and 4-H Council Representatives
- Send list of new officers, club leaders, and project leaders to the Extension Office. They may be emailed to brandymarie@ksu.edu
- Announce to club parents that you are recruiting project leaders and other volunteers (Parent Advisory Committee, New Family Coordinator, etc.).
- National 4-H Week is October 4-10 - How will your 4-H club and 4-H families celebrate National 4-H Week? How can you promote 4-H in your community?
- Encourage members to fill out Achievement Pin applications, Project Report Forms, Key Awards, I Dare You, etc. They are due to the Extension Office Sept 18. (Check with your club leader for your club deadline)
- Work with Club Officers/Parents to make club handbook with member/leader contact info, monthly meeting information (date/time/project talks/demonstrations). A copy should be given to each family.
- Make plans to attend 4-H Achievement Celebration (October 25, 5 pm; Pottorf Hall, meal provided, RSVP needed).

Volunteers are needed to review Project Report Form from Pottawatomie County this year. Each club is required to provide two volunteers!
